PROPOSED REVISIONS TO FMHA BY-LAWS

At their September meeting, the Board of Directors appointed Tom Johnson and Sally Ann Lyle to create a proposal to add some clarifying items to the current By Laws. That proposal will be presented at the Annual Meeting for a vote of the membership. Proposed changes appear in bold type. Please consult your directory for the complete current By Laws.

3.2 The categories of membership shall include:

3.2.1. Individual: Individual person regardless of age.

3.2.2. Family: Immediate family, including children up to 18 years of age **living at the same address.**

3.2.3 Farm or business partnership (2 memberships)

4.8 All Officers and Directors will be members age 18 or older

6.1 The Notice of the annual meeting shall include the report of the Nominating Committee. The notice shall be sent to the membership by the Secretary/Treasurer at least thirty (30) days prior to the annual meeting.

6.1.2 Prior to voting at the Annual Meeting, nominations from the floor will be accepted.

6.3 A Voting Member is an Individual, Family, or Farm/Business member age 18 or older.

7.2. At all meetings of the membership, a quorum shall be deemed present when at least 15% of the voting members are present.

ed note: the following was originally written in the early 90's by Paul Studebaker, then President of the Heart of America Morgan Ass. It seems every bit as timely today.

THE MEANING OF LIFE (in the Morgan Horse World)

Our ancient Greek Philosophers, Aristotle, Plato, et al, often contemplated the meaning of life. A recent Heart of America, Board of Directors meeting, at which we attempted to address and resolve the perpetual problem of an apathetic membership, gave me cause to reflect on "The Meaning of Life" in a much narrower sense-- "in the Morgan Horse World" or more simply- What do we, as Morgan Horse owners/enthusiasts, hope to receive from our breed associations?

The Morgan Horse, "Pride and Product Of America"/"America's First Breed", etc., is extolled as a versatile/do-it-all animal who can fulfill our every equine dream. It is perhaps this very virtue, which draws us to the breed, that is largely responsible for the fragmentation we experience in our Morgan Horse World. This versatility inherently results in owners/members ranging from those with professionally trained and shown Park horses to those with lovingly scratched-behind-the-ears backyard horses. This same versatility results in the diversity of backgrounds and "walks-of-life" from which these owners hail. It then falls to association leaders, both locally and nationally, to formulate and execute a one-size-fits-all program which answers the needs of each and every member, although these needs are often neither defined nor communicated.

Regardless of our individual propensity for Horse Showing, Trail-riding, Dressage, Carriage Driving or backyard ear-scratching, the one commonality of this diverse group is our love and admiration of The Morgan Horse. Perhaps the most rewarding aspect of membership in the Heart of America Morgan Horse Association or other breed association is the fellowship and general breed enlightenment inherent to sharing "Pot-luck" dinners, video viewings (regardless of subject matter), barn visitations, etc. The Morgan World is unique in that it is small enough to allow expansion of our horizons. It is relatively easy for Morgan owners to develop contacts and friendships throughout the country. Consequently, our worlds are larger and all of our visions less myopic. Through involvement in organized functions, be they shows, driving events, dressage, etc, this expansion can encompass other equine enthusiasts. The opportunities for our growth and/or fulfillment are limited only by our degree of participation and contribution.

The payment of dues to become a member of any special interest group clearly entitles us to:

- 1) Receive a copy of any and all newsletters, directories or other communications.
- 2) Receive any and all real and material benefits which may be made available.
- 3) THE RIGHT TO PARTICIPATE!!

MEET THE PROS

CHERI BARBER

Cheri Barber is one of the few people who do not have to request Hertz's Never Lost GPS system when she finds herself in Oklahoma City for the annual Grand National. Cheri grew up exactly nineteen blocks north of the Oklahoma State Fairgrounds on her parents nine acre Boots & Saddle stable. Cheri's father daily supervised trail rides through adjacent Will Rogers Park and her mother did private equitation instruction. Cheri was showing at the Fairgrounds before the Morgan Grand National ever entered Oklahoma City. Of course, at that time, the "main" arena was the old Barn 1 warm-up ring!

Cheri's college plans did not include "winds sweeping down the plains". When selecting a school, she chose about as far away from the windy state as possible, the University of Miami (yes, Glenn, she is a 'Cane). After graduation Cheri continued showing horses from a Miami stable.

After many years showing Arabians, Cheri was introduced to a Morgan in the form of Dave Karcher's chestnut mare, Betsy Ross, and later, Emmy Mangels' mare, Appleton Inspiration. In 1980 Cheri met Carol (then Bailey) Hudson. Their partnership in Morgan horses has remained to this day. Cheri lives, trains and breeds Morgan horses at the facility that Carol and she built in Ocala in 1982.

AMHA CREATES NEW PROGRAM FOR SHOWS

Starting in 2010, all shows with Morgan classes can apply to AMHA to receive a "Star Rating," a way to encourage horse owners to compete on all levels and for smaller shows to expose others to the breed.

AMHA Executive Director Julie Broadway said Morgan horse owners from around the country have asked to learn more about "fun, affordable" shows outside of regional competitions and USEF-rated shows. "AMHA wants to be the source of information about competitions of all types and sizes that showcase the Morgan," she said. "Plus, AMHA wants to encourage horse owners to compete at all levels to show the beauty and versatility of the breed. Often multi-breed, smaller shows are a great way to expose others to the Morgan."

The AMHA Star Rating Competition Program was designed with two goals in mind: to educate and increase awareness of all types and levels of competitions that promote the breed and to provide a tool to help horse owners identify affordable, convenient competitions where they can enjoy the fun of showing and test their skills. The rating also is a tool to allow novices to compare the offering of competitions so they can choose the right venues for them; as their level of experience and confidence grows, riders and drivers can select higher-rated competitions.

Show ratings are one to four stars, with Regional Shows being an exception. Shows that participate in the program will receive extra publicity and promotion by AMHA. 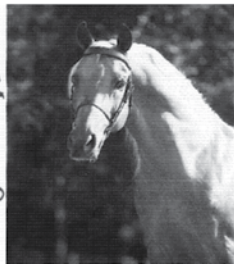
