MARCH 13 -UPCOMING CLINIC - YOGA & RIDING

Whoa-Ga!(TM)(rhymes with yoga) is a new riding and fitness program combining yoga and horseback riding. Unlike other yoga programs for equestrians, Whoa-Ga riders use asanas while riding to control the horse's gait and direction. From the waist down, riders use the asana, or posture along with the weight distribution that it demonstrates to manipulate the horse's balance. Balance is the biggest key to riding. Our horse's feel every move we make when we are astride, and react to every unbalanced move however subtle. Yoga teaches us how to recognize the unbalanced errors and correct them before we get on the horse. With body awareness and balance we can clearly see where our weight is shifting and understand what our horse is feeling. These subtleties are affecting our horse's confidence and behavior. How can we expect him to trust a person to guide him if he (the rider) can't even manage his own weight? A balanced confident rider creates a balanced confident horse.

Cathy Reynolds is a career horse person. She began her riding career at age nine, riding saddle seat on Morgans. As a teen she got jobs as a working student and rode hunter jumpers and dressage horses, occasionally competing in shows. Most of her career was training green horses: later she began teaching riders. She served two apprenticeships. The first was training thoroughbred racehorses. She also worked with riding instructor Gincy Bucklin. After taking a maternal break with her two children, Cathy studied therapeutic riding and has been double-certified by the North American Riding for the Handicapped Association (NARHA) for regular and advanced disabilities. She is also certified as a yoga instructor by the AFIA.. She is clinician, author, and yoga instructor and the creator of an innovative way to incorporate yoga and horseback riding.

MEET THE GAIGALS

We are happy to share a little something about ourselves with your membership.

We are Native Long Island New Yorkers in our 60's, Retired from professional careers and now living on Marco Island in FL since the early 2000's. We run Creekside Morgans, a NY partnership, from afar in the winter and hands on in the summer.

Marion is from a NY potato farming family that was lifelong friends with Mary Arnold, a founder and first president of NY State Morgan Horse Society in the 50's. Mary and her husband George put the Morgan "bug" in Marion long before we were married in 1970.

Our horses in chronological order both deceased and alive were/are:

1. Joe bought Marion her first Morgan Mare - H.A. KITTY HARRIS (Bald MT. Fireglow X Williams Wales Lady) in May of 1974. "Kitty, was foaled May 19, 1971. and died August 3, 2005, in her 35th year.
2. Kitty's stable mate for most of her life was her half sister, ARNONA CATHLEEN, Foaled March 9, 1975 (Bald Mt Fireglow X Arnona Chloe L.) She will be beginning her 37th year of life in about 2 months.
3. CENTURY SPITFIRE "Spit"(Wham Bam Command X Legacy's Radiant Joy) foaled May 08, 1987, died July 7, 2010.
4. CLEARVIEW LADONNA (Morgana's Marquis X Delight of Morgana) foaled May 28, 1988, a former park mare with a reputation, is in foal to Ultra's Special Agent and due in May.
5. SEAWAY ADMIRAL "Willie" (Immortal Command X Saddleback Superette) foaled March 24, 1992 a Gelding, died December 2, 2008. He was a super horse/did everything and in his memory/honor we now sponsor an Annual Junior Exhibitor Award for Champion and Res Champ at the NYSMHS High Point in early December. The Awards are pieces of jewelry custom made by Churchwells of NC.
6. LPV GRAND DESIGN "Tony" (Saddleback Sirius X Niobrara Lady Trophy) foaled June 19, 1998, a gelding.. Tony took a ton of Blues in 2010 with Julia Strier, a Junior Exhibitor, aboard at NY shows, Mass Morgan & Connecticut Summer Classic He was also 2010 NYSMHS Western Pleasure Junior Exhibitor High Point Champion, and other major wins.Tony is For Sale.
7. LPV EXCALIBUR "Rocky" (Aquarian Royal Comet X LPV Elegantly Supreme) foaled February 12, 2001, a gelding. Rocky, also with Julia Strier aboard, took a ton of Blues, Championships, and Res Champs in 2010 at NY shows, Mass Morgan, & the Connecticut Summer Classic. Rocky went on to OKC and placed 6th in GN WC Classic Pleasure Junior Exhibitor. Rocky went back to NY High Point and took 2 more High Point Champs for 2010. If he is not sold, by season, rocky will be shown again is 2011. Rocky is For Sale.
8. GDT JAMES BOND "James" (HRH Legend Command X HRH True Blue) foaled April 30, 2001 a gelding. James sired two fillys and a colt before we gelded him this past year. James will be shown in 2011 and is also for sale

9. JNP TOTAL ECLIPSE "Zora" (Simply Masserati X L'Cima My Flaire Lady) Foaled May 13, 2004, a mare. Zora is in training and may be shown is 2011.

Zora is For Sale.

10. KEY MEMORY "Dallas" (HVK Belle Flaire X Nanton's Marcia A) foaled May 16, 2005, a mare. Dallas has a heart like Secretariat, we've not yet decided her future; she has no recent show record but is in training and may be shown in 2011.

11.WILLOHAVEN TIMELESS "Ooh-Rah" (Cartier X Emotion's of War) foaled March 19, 2008, a Stallion. Ooh-Rah is in training and may be shown in hand and in harness in 2011.

12. CSD's BONDING AGENT "Mia" (Ultras Special Agent X Clearview LaDonna) foaled March 23, 2009, a mare. Mia, a yearling, took the Junior Mares Championship at NY Regional in 2010. She is growing up.

13. KEY SERA SERA "Sera" (Minion Millennium X Fascination Street x Bourbon Street) foaled May 12, 2009, a mare. Sera is big for her age and loves to work. She is in training.

14. JDS SPIRIT OF THE CENTURY "Remmy" (JDS Legal Enforcer X Liberation Spirit Electra) foaled June 3, 2010, a colt.

Of our 14 Morgans ever; 3 are deceased, Kitty, Spit & Willie. One is at the retirement home and will soon celebrate 37 years; Cathleen. Three are in the nursery; LaDonna is waiting to give birth and Mia and Remmy are growing up. And Seven are in training at the Lingering Hill Stable of Mari and Travis Neidlinger, a mother and son team, in Afton, NY

In 2009 we were jointly awarded the NYSMHS PROMOTION AWARD for our efforts in promoting the Morgan Horse. We had what we think was a very good 2010 season showing Rocky, Tony, Mia and Ooh-Rah.

We are individually Life members of both the AMHI and the AMHA, and members of the NYSMHS. Marion is a Western District Director of NYSMHS, and we are both on the NYSMHS Central NY Morgan Horse Show Committee. That show is at the Chemung County Fairgrounds, Horseheads NY on June 11-12, 2011.

SPOTLIGHT ON OUR YOUTH



EMMA BANKS

Emma Banks is looking forward to her final year in the 11 and under walk/trot division. This will mark her third year riding her favorite Morgan RBC the Profit. Emma was the Jr. Youth of the year in 2010 at the Citrus Cup Horse Show and is looking forward to participating in the contest again. The dream of taking her horse to National keeps her working hard never forgetting to enjoy her ride!

MCKENZIE WUNDERLE

On January 8, 2011, at the Barrington Hills Equestrian Complex, Dade City, Florida, McKenzie G. Wunderle competed as a team member with the Interscholastic Equestrian Association (IEA), Team name: Cypress Trails, Odessa Florida.

McKenzie rode representing the Middle School level team competition, and this team competition marks McKenzie's first official showing discipline (Judged) for: Walk, trot, canter. There are different levels of showing for the High School level team competition and Middle School level team competition with the IEA, at each show. In each event the rider competes in, the rider is assigned a different horse. The assignment of horse to rider, is based upon the rider's assigned IEA number and the draw for the horse they will compete with (each event). A major difference we saw from the FMHA Shows to this IEA team competition, is that at the FMHA shows, the girls are able to put their long hair in a bun yet, at the IEA show, all of the hair goes under the helmet. If you already have a snug helmet, placing long locks of hair under the helmet - this can be an impossible task.

McKenzie rode in two Hunt Seat Classes; Future Novice Equitation on the Flat, and Future Novice o/f x-rails (new for McKenzie). The results for Hunt Seat Equitation on the Flat, of seven riders in the class, McKenzie scored a first place ribbon, riding a 17 hand horse (Breed of horse: Tracainter) and the results for Hunt Seat Over the x-rails with nine riders in the class (Breed of Horse: Unknown) was: Out of the ribbons. McKenzie has had only a couple of lessons over rails, and is working hard to perfect her style and ability for future shows. We have found that her Morgan horse; SWR Fleet Regal (Prince), is eager to jump x-rails and higher.

At the end of the day, all the teams that competed gathered for the awards ceremony (it was cool to see each team in their team colors and the energy created as the champion and reserve champions were identified), the Cypress Trails Middle School team for January 8, 2010, was awarded High Point Ch gaining the most points in competition on this date against eight other teams from around Florida. They received a beautiful championship ribbon and trophy.

MEET VICI SURR

Vici is originally from West Newbury, MA, and more recently from Manchester, NH. She first learned to ride at Orland Farm in West Newbury. She has owned and shown horses for over 40 years, most of those horses have been Morgans.

Her current horse is FR Freedom First (Fred), an eight-year-old chestnut gelding by Townshend Top Hat, a Merri-lee son, out of UC Rianna (by UC Ringmaster).

For many years Vici and her horses have been a presence in show and driving events in the New England region, showing Fred's mother Rianna first in Morgan hunter pleasure, and then switching to the carriage driving division, and Fred first in hand, and then in carriage driving.

Vici and her horses have earned multiple USEF National Horse of the Year Championships in Morgan Carriage Driving, twice with Rianna, and once with Fred. Her horses have also won the USEF National Horse of the Year Championships in Carriage Pleasure Driving Singles and Driven Dressage. Fred was Reserve Champion in the All American Futurity at New England Morgan Horse Show in 2005.

Vici has been USEF National Leading Owner of the Year Champion in both the Morgan and Carriage Pleasure Driving Divisions, and USEF National Leading Breeder in Carriage Pleasure Driving. Both horses have earned the \$1000 Northeast Morgan Carriage Pleasure Driving Open Championship, and numerous year-end and high-point championships.

Known for her wide smile, Vici became a familiar face at the New England Morgan breed shows. "I love this," she beams, "I get to go on vacation with my horse, what could be better?" She describes the carriage driving division at these shows, "the carriage people are great, we all support each other, and cheer each other on, yet we are extremely competitive. The competition has to be totally honest, however. If someone needs a hand with something, or a piece of equipment to get into the ring, we will all pitch in and help. Then we all go into the ring and compete to do our best. There is this feeling that we need each other both outside of the ring and in the ring. I love coming to these shows, it is like hanging out with my horsey family."

Vici is the owner of Freedom Rider, an online and print catalog for people with disabilities who ride horses. She is active in the North American Riding for the Handicapped Association, and Freedom Rider is an annual corporate sponsor of the national NARHA Conference. Freedom Rider also contributes to the US Disabled Driving Team. Vici has recently introduced adaptive equipment for people who drive horses, which can be seen at www.freedomrider.com.

Vici explains how the stories of Freedom Rider and her Morgans became so intertwined:

I have had horses since I was a kid, mostly Morgans, but some other breeds as well. I was very active in 4-H both as a youth and then for a brief time as the State 4-H Horse Program Leader for Massachusetts. As a teenager and young adult, I showed my Morgan mare in the local shows. When I didn't have a horse of my own, I was usually fortunate enough to find someone who would let me ride theirs.

Some time ago, I had been keeping my Morgan gelding, riding and training with Elsie Rodney, in Weston, Mass. I sold my gelding and I found myself without a horse. At Elsie's barn there was a disabled woman who had a Morgan gelding named Freedom (Kendalwood Freedom). This woman, Linda, was looking for someone to assist her with some of the physical aspects of helping her with her horse, especially at the carriage driving events that she participated in. So in exchange for riding Freedom, I started going to carriage driving shows with Linda.

Linda and I became friends. I acted as her able bodied whip while she drove in carriage dressage and pleasure driving classes. It was through a conversation with Linda that I had the brainstorm of an idea that became Freedom Rider.

I had just started researching equipment and products when the unthinkable happened. Freedom died. It was very sudden, the vet said it was most likely an aneurysm. It was very devastating to Linda and me, but especially to Linda. At Linda's suggestion, I named my fledgling business Freedom Rider, after the horse that had meant so much to her.

Elsie Rodney found another horse for Linda, a nice Morgan mare whose name was UC Rianna. Linda continued to drive and show, and I rode Rianna. Freedom Rider became a real catalog and time went by.

Then, about seven years ago, for a variety of reasons, Linda decided to no longer continue with carriage driving and decided to sell Rianna. I bought her without hesitation.

Rianna and Vici showed in Hunter Pleasure classes for the first year she owned her. Elsie kept telling Vici that she should be driving Rianna in carriage classes, but Vici really wanted to ride. At Elsie's urging, Vici began to show Rianna in a few driving classes.

I always say I was dragged kicking and screaming into carriage driving, but as soon as I discovered the variety the division offered, I became one of its great supporters. From the precision of dressage to the thrill of the speed and accuracy of obstacle classes, there is so much to work on and coordinate to keep a horse versatile enough to do it all.

Vici has suspended showing horses in order to care for her parents. She currently lives with her father in Naples, FL. Her mother passed away in February 2010.

Vici is a Lifetime Member of the American Morgan Horse Association, USEF, the American Driving Society, the North American Riding for the Handicapped Association, and many local Morgan horse clubs, riding clubs and driving clubs.

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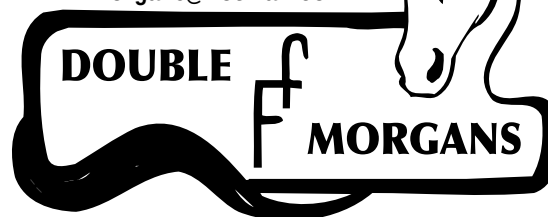
