REVISED WESTERN DRESSAGE RULES

The Western Dressage Association of America (WDAA) rules incorporate elements of both Western and Dressage disciplines. The revision of the rules was a collaborative effort on the part of member feedback, evaluation of respected horse people, and equine organizations, and edited by a team of our Advisory Board members championed by Anita Owen, FEI Olympic Dressage judge.

The resulting rules are designed for use by judges and show managers, but also for riders of all experience levels. These rules are an educational tool with highlights that include detailed gait descriptions, movements, and goals and objectives, all of which will help design a progressive learning and training program regardless of intent to show or ride in any other discipline. U.S. FINISHES SIXTH AT THE FEI WORLD SINGLES DRIVING CHAMPIONSHIP

This strong finish demonstrated a marked improvement for the U.S. Driving Team after having placed 11th at the 2010 World Championships. Leading the U.S. individually was Sterling Graburn, who completed his second World Championship in 22nd place.
