FMHA Annual Meeting January 16, 2021 Southeastern Livestock Pavilion Ocala, FL

Meeting was called to order by Martha Stein (FMHA President) and she welcomed everyone.

She talked about the changes to the club's By-Laws, that had been previously published in the Winter 2020 edition of the FMHA Newsletter. The changes were passed unanimously.

New business was brought to the floor by Karen Gardner (FMHA Vice President) and Martha.

Mary Jo Schmidt talked about the UPHA Ocala International show.

Nannet Read gave a about the SYH All Breed Extravaganza.

They went over what is required to put on the show and how to film the riders and how to admit the videos to the website. These shows will count towards High Points in 2021 and will be readdressed for 2022.

The Tropical Trotters Youth Club is welcoming new members for this year! The goal of our club is to promote friendship among different barns and learn more about horsemanship along the way. There's no membership fee as we are encouraging all interested youth to join. It doesn't matter where you live as our monthly meetings are now held virtually and there's a new Teams Program that allows members to be part of a team together but live far apart! The group will plan charity fundraisers, ways to promote the Morgan horse at local fairs or functions, and plan fun activities during horse shows so that members can get to know each other better. We encourage all members to share their ideas as the club belongs to all of them! Currently there are 21 members! We have boys and girls that are just taking lessons and beginning to learn about horses, and others are seasoned horse girls. The more variety, the better the club becomes! We are continually looking for anyone that would like to be a quest speaker during our monthly meetings.

The AMHA has made exciting changes to the youth programs!

They created the AMHA Youth Patch Project for youth to earn badges for completing and participating in programs such as :

Completing the Figure and Bulrush Workbooks, Becoming a member of the Teams Point Program, Participating in the Grand National Youth of the Year Contest.

Win a gold or silver Medal Class, and Becoming a member of the Youth Council.

Anyone who wants to be a youth member of the AMHA can receive a free year membership by completing the first level Figure Workbook.

There is a Teams Point Program that youth can earn points to be the year end highest earning points winner, and also earn points as a team to be the highest earning points team winner. Points can be earned from doing basic barn chores, helping with camps and lessons, taking lessons, showing, school work, and many others. It's a great program as includes all types of horse related activities to earn the points. The Tropical Trotters are a recognized team if anyone wants to join in. Or if any barns would like to create their own team, they may do so by signing up on the AMHA website. There's still these other programs that haven't changed.

The UPHA Ribbons of Service is a way that youth can volunteer their time helping in their community and raising money for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital or other charities while showing horses.

The Youth Of The Year Contest is a fun way to show how much you've learned about horses! There's four categories to participate in. They are a written test of horse knowledge, a pattern to ride with your horse, a speech about a certain horse related topic, and sometimes a category on horse judging. It's open to all levels starting at walk trot up to anyone the age of 21. The contest will be held April 14-17, 2021 during the Citrus Cup Horse Show.

The Youth Council is a group covering all 50 states and its members have the goal of promoting the Morgan breed, raising awareness of local Morgan horse clubs, and its members strive to be positive role models and offer guidance to other youth.
